My name is Daniele Ganser. I am very happy that this event can take place today. I haven't organized it. Just like you, I am simply a guest listening. I am delighted that Richard Gage has come here from San Francisco, because we don't have any research about 9/11 in Switzerland. But we observe the research in the USA and we translate it from English to German. I have oriented myself very much to Richard Gage's research during the last 12 years or so. And from my side, I can only say that it is very difficult in Switzerland to speak about 9/11 at all – in public. In fact the label conspiracy theory or conspiracy theorist is used immediately. This is the main obstacle, it's not so much the facts.

Whoever engages the facts, will see quickly, that a new investigation is necessary and that the story as we are told is not conclusive.

But people are afraid, afraid of being called a conspiracy theorist. Afraid to lose their money.

Afraid of being attacked in the papers or even on Swiss TV – this too may happen!

This is why I believe that 9/11 is like an exercise – not so much if one is able to think critically, but rather if one can overcome the fear.

This is my thesis which I have been verifying also in practice since many years – and it works!

Actually I want to tell you this: You can speak about 9/11 – then you will get attacked, you have problems – but life goes on. Yes, this is empirically proven: one won't die when one enters the discussion.
